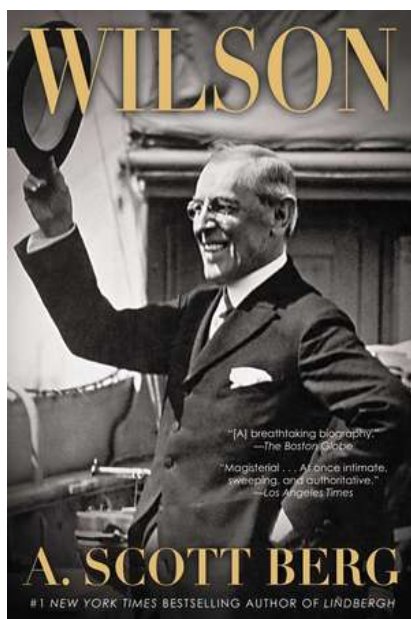

## Dr. Paulette Harris to Speak on Wilson's Reading Disorder, September 30



Woodrow Wilson was one of several accomplished historic figures who had dyslexia-like problems learning to read. Such problems make reading skills extremely difficult to master at a normal pace. In spite of his learning to read challenges, Wilson exceeded expectations within and outside of school. Eventually, he became President of Princeton University, an author of several books including a five volume *History of the American People*, the Governor of New Jersey, and the 28th President of the United States. Wilson's determination is evidence that we are more than a sum of our genetics and that you should never judge a book by its cover.

Dr. Paulette Harris, Cree-Walker Professor in the College of Education at GRU and founder/director of the GRU Literacy Center, will speak on the topic of
