Historic Augusta Seeks Nominations for Both 2020 Endangered Properties List and 2019 Preservation Awards

During the summer, Historic Augusta is accepting nominations for two of its annual programs; the 2020 Endangered Properties List and the 2019 Preservation Awards.

The **Endangered Properties List** was started in 2006 and, like other similar programs across the country, is used as a tool for the organization to advocate and educate about historic properties facing an uncertain future.

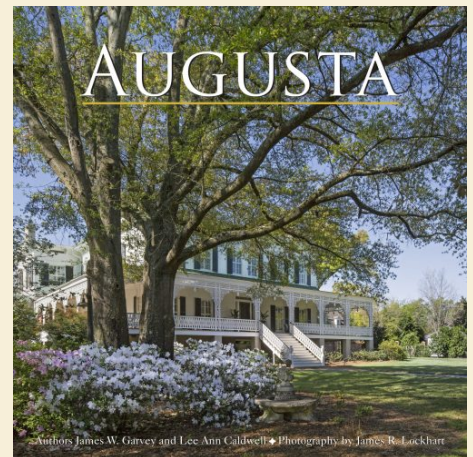

The **criteria** for inclusion on the list are:

- A building that is at least 50 years old and should be listed or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places.
- The building should have an identified threat such as: vacancy, neglect, encroachment by development, or inappropriate alterations.
- The building should be historically or architecturally significant in its own right, or can be representative of a particular type or style.

Properties will be reviewed by the Preservation Committee and the final list will be announced at a press conference typically held in the month of November. **Deadline for submission for the Endangered Properties List is Friday August 30th.**

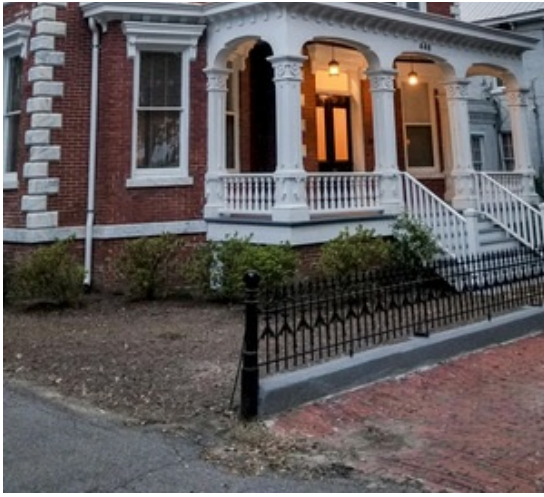

The Zachariah Daniel House, 448 Greene Street, received a 2018 Historic Augusta Preservation Award and was previously included on the 2015 Endangered Properties List.

The **Preservation Awards** are presented each year during Historic Augusta's Annual Meeting. Historic Augusta recognizes property owners who have made **significant contributions to the preservation, rehabilitation, and/or restoration of historic buildings and sites**. Eligible properties must be located in Augusta, Richmond County or Columbia County, Georgia and must be at least 50 years old and/or certifiable as a historic structure. The property must retain a high degree of historical integrity and must be currently occupied or have constructive plans in place for its use. **Preservation Awards criteria include:**

- Saving the property from an uncertain fate
- Preserving a formerly dilapidated historic structure through generally accepted restoration, or rehabilitation standards.
- Extensive repairs to the interior and/or exterior. Simply updating an interior, including kitchens and baths and redecorating, does not qualify a property for an award.
- Returning a structure to its original appearance with appropriate historic materials

Visit the Boyhood Home of President Woodrow Wilson This Summer !



We look forward to seeing you this summer as you visit the Boyhood Home of President Woodrow Wilson, a **National Historic Landmark** and the oldest Presidential residence in the state of Georgia! Guided tours of the house are given **Thursday-Saturday 10:00am until 4:00pm** beginning at the top of the hour. All tours begin with a twelve minute video followed by a tour of the house with one of our tour guides. Following the tour, all guests are able to view the permanent exhibit discussing Wilson's life after he moved from Augusta. Tickets may be purchased on-site at time of arrival and we encourage groups of 10 or more to make a reservation in advance of your visit. **Tickets are \$5 per adult, \$4 per senior, and \$3 for students K-12.**
