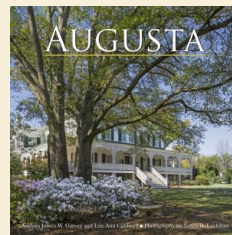

Nathan Vick's interest in architecture started very young. As a six-year old boy, he loved building structures with Legos and was taken with the modern buildings on his trips to Atlanta which inspired his interest in design and construction. Nathan studied architecture at Southern Polytechnic State University (now Kennesaw State University) where he received his Bachelor of Architecture degree. He began his career at PGN Architects in Washington DC before returning home to Augusta. Upon his return, Nathan was hired at Christopher Booker and Associates, where he is now a Principal Architect.

Nathan is the Secretary on the Executive Committee of Historic Augusta's Board of Trustees. He and his firm have been involved in many tax credit projects, including: Wagon Works at 941 Ellis Street, the Handkerchief Factory at 943 Ellis Street, 620 Broad Street, 212 Seventh Street, Kahrs Grocers at 401 Greene Street, 215 Twelfth Street and Kennedy Building at 1022-1026 Broad Street which both received a preservation award from the Georgia Trust.

Nathan is clearly passionate about his work. He is interested in historic preservation as well as contemporary architecture and likes to see the adaptive reuse of historic buildings. He was influenced by such architects as Marcel Breuer and Ludwig Mies van der Rohe. He is intrigued by the melding of technology and design which provides his clients with a 3-D rendition of their projects. Two current projects include the new Mellow Mushroom location at 1102 Broad Street and the HUB, a coalition led by the Community Foundation for the CSRA, the Boys and Girls Clubs of CSRA, and the

Medical College of Georgia Foundation. The project, at Chafee and Fenwick Streets, will include two buildings that will house several non-profits.

Nathan, his wife and three children live in the 1836 Darling-Dennis House located on five acres which once was a dairy farm. The property was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1991. The Vicks updated the bathrooms and kitchen and completed a full electrical renovation.

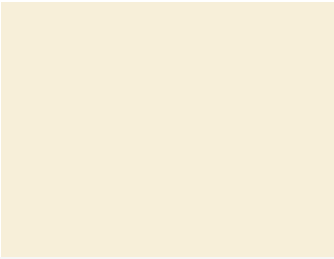
