## Open House at Mary Warren Home, March 5th



Don't miss the opportunity attend the open house at the Mary Warren Home, 2109 Central Avenue, during First Thursday in the Summerville neighborhood March 5<sup>th</sup>, 6:00-10:00pm. Built in 1915 and designed by prominent Augusta architect G. Lloyd Preacher, the Mary Warren Home was listed to Historic Augusta's Endangered Properties List for 2015 and was recently purchased by a local developer. The property is being rehabilitated for use as student housing and many original character defining features are being preserved including massive brick fireplaces and wooden ceiling beams and moldings. As a certified historic structure in the Summerville Historic District, the owners have applied for certified historic rehabilitation tax credits and the work will be done according to the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation. Historic Augusta encourages you to take advantage of the opportunity to see this preservation project in progress!
